

The primary objective of this research policy is to establish a structured framework that outlines the principles, responsibilities, and procedures governing research activities at Malabar Training College. The policy emphasizes the importance of academic freedom, ethical practices, interdisciplinary approaches, and community-oriented research. Recognizing the need for financial support to catalyze research activities, Malabar Training College has introduced a seed money scheme. Under this scheme, faculty members can apply for an initial research grant to initiate small-scale projects, pilot studies, or exploratory research. The seed money can be used for purchasing necessary materials, software, and equipment, conducting fieldwork, organizing data collection, and other research-related expenses. The allocation of seed money is based on the merit of the research proposal, its feasibility, and its potential impact. Priority is given to proposals that align with the college's strategic research areas, which include educational technology, inclusive education, pedagogical innovations, and community-based interventions.

In addition to financial assistance, the college provides comprehensive infrastructural support to facilitate research activities. Faculty and students have access to well-equipped laboratories, a rich library with an extensive collection of books and journals, and high-speed Wi-Fi connectivity

throughout the campus. The college has subscribed to several academic databases and e-resources, enabling researchers to stay updated with the latest developments in their respective fields. Dedicated research spaces and computing facilities are also available to support data analysis and report writing. College also granting study leave for research purpose.

To build research capacity among faculty and students, the college regularly organizes expert classes, seminars, workshops, and training programs. These events are conducted in collaboration with renowned academicians, researchers, and professionals from reputed institutions. They cover a wide range of topics such as research methodology, data analysis techniques, academic writing, grant proposal development, and intellectual property rights.
