

WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY



Malabar Training College Waste Management Policy

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish a comprehensive waste management framework that ensures environmentally responsible disposal, reduction, and recycling of waste generated within Malabar Training College. It aims to promote sustainability, protect public health, and ensure compliance with local and national environmental regulations.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all students, teaching and non-teaching staff, administrative personnel, and visitors within the premises of Malabar Training College.

3. Objectives

- To minimize the generation of waste.
- To segregate waste at the source.
- To encourage the reuse and recycling of materials.
- To ensure safe and environmentally sound disposal of waste.
- To promote awareness on sustainable waste practices among stakeholders.

4. Categories of Waste

- 1. Biodegradable Waste: Food scraps, garden waste, paper, etc.
- 2. Non-Biodegradable Waste: Plastics, metal, glass, etc.
- 3. Electronic Waste: Batteries, e-waste
- 4. Sanitary Waste: Sanitary napkins, diapers, etc.

5. Policy Guidelines

a. Waste Segregation

- Separate labeled bins (biodegradable, non-biodegradable, hazardous, sanitary) shall be placed in strategic locations across the campus.
- Color-coded bins: Green (organic), Blue (recyclable), Red (hazardous), Yellow (sanitary).

b. Waste Collection and Disposal

Daily collection of waste by designated staff.

- Organic waste to be composted on-campus using compost bins or sent to a local composting facility.
- Recyclables to be handed over to authorized recycling agencies.
- Hazardous and sanitary waste to be disposed of following local municipal and health guidelines.

c. E-Waste Management

- Separate collection points for old electronics and batteries.
- Tie-ups with certified e-waste recyclers for responsible disposal.

d. Education and Awareness

- · Regular workshops and campaigns on waste management and sustainability.
- Integrating waste management topics into the curriculum where applicable.

e. Roles and Responsibilities

- Students and Staff: Follow segregation rules, reduce waste, and participate in sustainability programs.
- Housekeeping Staff: Daily monitoring, cleaning, and disposal in compliance with this policy.

6. Monitoring and Evaluation

- The Waste Management Committee shall be responsible for periodic audits, reporting, and policy updates.
- Feedback mechanisms will be established to encourage suggestions and address non-compliance.

7. Compliance

Non-compliance with this policy may result in disciplinary actions as per college rules. All members of the college community are expected to contribute actively to its implementation.

8. Review and Revision

This policy will be reviewed annually and revised as necessary to align with updated regulations or changing needs of the college.
